#### Stake Leadership and Vision


The Stake Presidency worked hard to create and distribute a vision for our Stake that this year would further the ideas that the Lord has been impressing upon them during the previous year.

- 1. President Monson's Rescue Initiative Rescue the lost, the needy, the poor in spirit
- 2. Self Reliance Have a people that are stronger, and more capable of helping themselves and others
- 3. Temple Work and Family History Remember our past, and through Temple service for them build our strength

What we hoped you saw during this year were stake activities and training that illuminated these goals. Here's a summary of some of the work that you may have seen or experienced in the stake during 2016.

- There were 3 stake conferences this year (Feb, Sep, Nov)
  - Feb the 3 goals were introduced to leaders, the idea of using Missionaries as Home Teachers to help with the Rescue, and some Family History videos were shown during conference to inspire us to find new/old ideas to record our own Histories
  - Sep Elder Brent H Nielson from the Seventy visited and taught us more about acting upon our inspirations, the commandment to assemble, organize, and prepare, the 3 parables of the Rescue, and that we are never alone in the work of salvation
  - Nov a multi-stake conference was broadcast from Church HQ to all stakes in the North America Central
    area. The presiding authority was Donald A. Rasband.
- March brought out special trainers from the Church Family History Dept, the Olers, to share principles of feeling
  the spirit through taking the opportunity to do family history work. We can become saviors on Mount Zion by
  using the Find-Take-Teach principles of family history. We can build our family tree by finding out about our
  ancestors, tell their stories, and do their temple work for them which can bring our families closer. The Church
  produced the MyFamily resources to help us do that.








• In May there was a special training given to stake and unit leaders from Elder Dale G. Renlund from the Quorum of the Twelve Apostles and his wife, Ruth Renlund and Elder Gary B. Sabin of the Seventy. The topics included strengthening individual conversion through increasing our faith in Jesus Christ, increasing the effectiveness of our Aaronic and Melchizedek Priesthood quorums, and how Sabbath Day observance and the Law of the Fast can help us do that.


• Starting in August, a Self reliance committee was started and over the coming months plans were created to facilitate the use of the new materials that were produced by the Church. The first focus was on Employment and using the MyPath and MyFoundation materials.





• September brought a Stake Family History event called Family Discovery Day to Saskatoon where presenters from our stake and from Salt Lake shared ideas on celebrating Family across the Generations.

• The US and Canada Area Plan was introduced to our Stake in September 2016.

We utilized the new broadcasting system at portal.ldswebcast.org. It helped and hindered in some ways but in the end helped us to identify training needs in the stake. A team of youth were called as ATS and a Technology Director was called at this conference. So a team of 4 will now be 11.

Use of role plays to demonstrate use of missionaries in home teaching and where/how they can be used. Encouraging Presidencies to consider assigning a purpose for Home Teaching visits - it's not about the lesson, but about helping each to progress toward an ordinance

Further training on use of 10 minutes huddles each Sunday (Ward Council members) to talk about Rescue Initiative assignments

Saturday largely focused on moving from geneology work to Family history work. Used a lot of member made videos to show what kinds of things can be made and inspire people to tell their stories, and make it meaningful work for our families. Theme was "To Turn our Hearts". Wet snow caused some families to return early or stay home and watch via Internet

Sunday's theme was on Self-Reliance, overcoming trials, and giving Service. Talks focused on how each of these can lead to sanctification through Christ's atonement.

We like to jam pack our training so that leaders are not required to travel the great distances that are in our stake.

#### Youth Events

#### Tri-stake and District Youth Conference – Apr 22-24

Press Forward was the theme. The youth conference was a huge success. We had over 220 youth and leaders attend the conference, held in Saskatoon this year. The Friday night arrivals went well, with each person receiving a lanyard (designed by Jo Clark & Kjell Erickson) and a cardinal red shirt (logo designed by Tallasse Crosby)

We had a fun dance, that began with a flash mob taught by a dance teacher from Meadow Green Ward. Then we continued the dance with great music, lights, and fun. The dance was DJ'd by Morgan Yaworski.

Saturday morning seemed to come quickly for some. We had a great breakfast, followed by an absolutely amazing keynote presentation by Brother Shaun Reid. We broke into our groups and cycled through the other presentations. We had Andrew Spencer, Jayson Earle, Maja Russell, Russel and Beth Butler, and President Doug Robertson present and all were very well done. The youth all reported feeling very spiritually uplifted.

After lunch we braved the cool windy weather to participate in the million graves project at Woodlawn cemetary. We were guided by Ward Historian, Sister Christine Burgess. Afterward, we played games until it was time to get changed for a formal supper and dance.

Sunday was another early start, including a change of venue, the Fairmont Chapel, to finish our conference. We had a beautiful testimony meeting, full of heartfelt emotions. Way to go, youth!! Afterwards, the youth packed up, grabbed their lunches, had many hugs and tears, and went back home.

The food was all fantastic, provided by Sister Brenda McKay, and assistance from all of the city wards. Everyone pitched in to make this a great experience.

#### Seminary Graduation – June 4

In collaboration with the Saskatoon Saskatchewan Stake YM & YM organizations a Youth Activity and Seminary Graduation occurred on June 4th. Out of 33 enrolled seminary students, 21 attended the youth activity in the afternoon, which was planned by the Stake Youth Committee, providing a variety of outside and inside games to help the youth interact with each other. One highlight is that four grade 8 students, that will be attending seminary for the first time in September attended the youth activity and graduation service (Jo Skitteral, Owen Clarke, Kelvin Creighton, and Jackson Reid), with Pacey Ledding attending the graduation service as well. After the activities, there was a meal in which around 60 individuals attended. A second success from this event was the opportunity to invite all the less-active 11 year old boys as well. There were a few special contacts made as invitations were hand delivered to these boys so they could know they are loved and remembered in our wards and branches.

#### **Adult Events**

#### Institute Graduation – Apr 9

On April 9<sup>th</sup>, 2016 around 30 individuals attended the institute graduation event for the Saskatoon, Saskatchewan Stake. These individuals consisted of young single adults, and leaders with their spouses. The theme of the event was "Family Dinner". The institute class that semester was The Eternal Family and those planning the event felt that having an informal family meal would be fitting. Chinese food was ordered and married couples and young single adults were able to converse about different life stages and experiences. 11 completion certificates were given out and one diploma was awarded to Katrina Robertson. President Keith Willoughby, a counselor in the stake presidency, provided the evenings remarks encouraging the students to continue with their spiritual learning. Many young single adults stayed after the meal to play games.

#### General Women's Meeting - Apr 16

We held a stake Women's Conference with the theme "Abound in Hope". A total of 110 sisters attended. Our day was filled with opportunities for sisters to strengthen their resolve to overcome challenges and become stronger followers of the Savior. We learned about how to look for hope in all aspects of daily life.

Our workshops varied from the eternal importance of hope to the significance of laughter in our lives.

For our service project, we collected a total of 168 brightly-colored children's pillow cases. These were made and donated by the sisters in the hopes of brightening the lives of children battling long-term illnesses.

#### Visit from an Apostle of the Lord – the Renlunds – May 13

In May, we were invited to attend a Priesthood Leadership Conference (PLC), which is often led by an Apostle, and attended by leaders from dozens of stakes. In the past we had travelled to Edmonton to join. This year, were invited to go to Winnipeg. We had priced out a bus to take 45 priesthood leaders, and were preparing to go. I asked our Area Seventy, Elder Spackman, how we might pay for the transportation. When Elder Spackman passed on the query, the planners from church headquarters asked, "Why do you ask? Is distance a problem?"

I confirmed that distance is not "a problem" per se, for we are used to travelling. Dozens of brethren were willing to take Friday off work to travel the distance to Saskatoon, and then the eight hours to Winnipeg and stay overnight. The trip would be enjoyable. Nonetheless, we could not afford the bus, so we wanted to know if the cost could be shared. When the organizers heard of us investing two days per leader (a total of about 800 hours in travel time), they quickly offered to broadcast it to us. One of the Quorum of the Twelve, however, had a different idea. Elder Dale G. Renlund offered to come here.

When I heard that, I asked if the training could be opened to the auxiliary leaders. Sister Ruth Renlund, a successful lawyer and leader, offered to speak to the sisters in the Relief Society, Primary and Young Women auxiliaries. A week later, she had extended it to be a devotional for all the sisters in the stake. This would require the use of the chapel, so the priesthood leaders would now need to meet in the Relief Society room. A detailed seating plan was drawn up to ensure the 67 brethren from northern Saskatchewan (and some from Manitoba and Alberta) could squeeze in.

So we saw a delightful act of service as Elder and Sister Renlund changed their schedule to save us from travelling. They decided to hold the PLC in Saskatoon on Friday, May 13, and then fly on to Winnipeg to join the other leaders the next morning. I picked up the Renlunds from the airport late Thursday, arriving at their hotel near midnight. Before they

retired, however, Elder Renlund was mindful that in addition to presiding at the PLC, the Lord had a specific purpose for him to come to Saskatoon. He asked me, "Is there anything I need to do while here?"

Elder Renlund did not know that a few days before he arrived, Don Tanner had asked for a blessing. He had an intractable infection and which had stumped the specialists using the most powerful antibiotics. The specialists had run out of options, and Brother Tanner's life was now in danger. At his wife's bidding, a brother had called me to ask for a blessing from Elder Renlund. A General Authority holds no more priesthood power than does a humble elder for blessings, so we are discouraged from making requests such as this. Nonetheless, I made the request, for its genesis was long before this trip was planned.

Years ago, Don Tanner had worked as a nurse with Elder Renlund when he was a practicing cardiologist. Brother Tanner viewed Dale Renlund as a "father figure" and one in whom he could confide. Over the years, Elder Renlund was sent to serve as a General Authority in Africa and then ordained as an Apostle, but he did not forget Brother Tanner. When Elder Renlund heard of Don's illness and dilemma, he enthusiastically obliged. The next morning, Elder Renlund met the Tanners. They embraced, and a Don received a blessing of healing. Elder Renlund said, "This may be the reason why I came here."

Nonetheless, there was still lots of work to do. The Renlunds presented to a zone conference of missionaries in the afternoon. That evening they presented at the PLC and the sisters' meeting.

Elder Renlund commented on how prepared and eager the participants were. He spoke on:

- Growing the church as in ancient times through the use of pairing the weak with the strong (84:108).
- Keeping the Sabbath day holy and the law of the fast.
- Giving a "reasonable effort" to our callings, and keep a balance. Be "aerobic, not anaerobic" so that we don't build up the spiritual equivalent of lactic acid. Even so, we are asked to contribute of our own free will, and there is a sacrifice attached to it.

Saturday morning, the Renlunds were up at 3:30 a.m. to catch their flight to Winnipeg. In my journal, I wrote, "I just dropped Elder and Sister Renlund at the airport an hour ago, and am filled with wonder at their willingness to come here, work all afternoon and evening with the missionaries and stake leaders, then leave early this morning to repeat it in Winnipeg. It was fascinating to see the anticipation of the brethren and sisters last night as they came to learn at the feet of an Apostle and his wife."

#### Visit from the Renlunds – Visit with the Sisters – May 13

Sister Ruth Renlund, wife of visiting apostle, Elder Dale G. Renlund, shared an evening with 155 sisters of the Saskatoon Stake.

As a true teacher of the gospel of Jesus Christ, Sister Renlund led a discussion on the talk given by President Russell M. Nelson, in Oct. 2015 conference entitled "A Plea to My Sisters". With thoughtful questions, she encouraged participation and guided our discussion to help us recognize that we as sisters in Zion, have priesthood power through our covenants.

We can call down the powers of Heaven to help us and to receive personal revelation in our daily lives. She reminded us of the power of a righteous woman's example and encouraged us to extend our sphere of influence. She taught us that the Savior enables us to do His work and sends us His godly influence as we partake of the sacrament each week. As we "tie ourselves" to Jesus Christ, He will help us to overcome our challenges. As we work together with our priesthood

leaders, we can, in quiet ways, gain their trust and confidence. In our marriages, we are to work together with our husbands as equal partners. Sister Renlund asked us to take to heart President Nelson's plea.
